Competition Conditions

Overview

Players must be a member of Stoke by Nayland Golf Club and either be a fully paid-up member of the Seniors Section or an Honorary Member of the Seniors Section.

To win a prize they must have played at least 12 qualifying rounds in the previous 12 months listed on their WHS record prior to the competition.

Competition Eligibility

Handicap Competitions:

For male handicap competitions, competitors are required to hold a WHS™ handicap which identifies that they are a male golfer.

Scratch Competitions:

For male scratch competitions, players may compete in a competition if any one of the following circumstances apply:

- their sex assigned at birth is male
- they identify as a transgender man
- they identify as non-binary

Rules of Entry

Entry to the various competitions is made by booking online using the HowDidiDo App

- HDiDo app (available from the Apple App Store or Google Play Store)

Competitions are visible online, HDiDo App, 4 weeks before and bookable 3 weeks before the competition. At the time of booking, payment of the entry fee is automatically deducted from your Competition Wallet.

On the day of the competition all competitors must sign in prior to playing via the HDiDo App or a PSI and collect their scorecard. (Unless it is a knockout).

If a competitor is unable to play in a competition that they have entered, it is their responsibility to remove their name/s from HDiDo or contact the Golf Shop.

Cancellation Policy

Cancellations on the day of the competition, or failure to attend, may incur the loss of the entry fee. Members who withdraw, or fail to attend, on the day of the competition, may email proshop@stokebynayland.com and explain the reason for their withdrawal and request a return of their entry fee.

Cancellations prior to the day automatically return the entry fee to the Competition Wallet.

Handicaps/Divisions

To ensure that Seniors Section events remain competitive for all players, regardless of ability, we operate a system of two divisions. Effective from January 2026 and until further notice, the definition of Division 1 and Division 2 status will be based on a player's World Handicap System (WHS) Index.

Division 1 +10.0 to 18.4 Handicap Index

Division 2 18.5 to 54.0 Handicap Index

Players will move between divisions as and when their WHS index changes.

Handicap allowances are governed by the WHS.

Monthly Stableford competitions are multi-tee events with Division 1 and Division 2 players having **the option** to play off the green, white or yellow tee boxes.

Under WHS changes 1st April 2024 any player using the white tee boxes no longer receives additional shots to their playing handicap due to the inclusion of 'Course Rating minus Par' in the Course Handicap calculation.

Depending on the course and the tees selected, players can check their competition playing handicap by looking at the score card and or when 'signing in' to the competition.

Players are expected to know their handicap allowance for any competition before teeing off. Please ensure you know exactly how many shots you receive before playing.

Scorecards

All players are totally responsible for all aspects of their own scorecards.

Cards should be correctly filled out ensuring the competition name, player's name, marker's name, date, time, course handicap and playing handicap percentage allowance, tee box played from, together with their score for each hole and the total clearly recorded.

When returning scores online, players are responsible for selecting the correct scorecard (white green or yellow tees) on ClubV1/HDID when 'signing in' or 'score input'. Failure to do this may result in recording the incorrect number of shots taken during your round or the amount of Stableford points earned and may result in disqualification.

It is very important that this is correct as the score input is immediate and directly linked to your WHS handicap at England Golf once your score has been posted on the system.

Injury or Illness

Should any player become unwell, injured or find it necessary to withdraw from a competition at any point during their round, they should get the necessary immediate help and at the very earliest opportunity ask someone to inform the senior's competition organiser of their decision to withdraw. Failure to do this often results in confusion at the end of the play and delays in closing the competition

Tied Scores

In the event of scores being tied after a competition, the following procedures will apply. Holes 1-18 will be counted in order, regardless of the starting hole of any competitor.

- 1st criteria - The best last 9 holes in total (holes 10-18)
- 2nd criteria – The best last 6 holes in total (holes 13 – 18)
- 3rd criteria – The best last 3 holes in total (holes 16-18)
- Then hole by hole if necessary (holes 18, 17 and 16)

Failure to Attend

If a competitor is unable to play in a competition that he has entered, it is his responsibility to remove his name from the start sheet. Once the start sheet has been closed on 'HowDidiDo' (usually two days before the event) the competitor must inform the Golf Shop at the earliest opportunity stating the reason for his inability to play. It is the onus of the competitor to ensure that his playing partner(s) are informed before they collect their cards from the Golf Shop. A competitor failing to observe this courtesy or repeatedly withdrawing from a competition at a late time, may be disciplined by the Management Board. This can lead to a ban of at least one month. However, if it is

felt a competition has been changed from normal (i.e. less than 18 holes in play or a predominance of temporary greens) a member may withdraw from the competition at late notice, as long as he informs either the Golf Shop or Golf Manager, without incurring disciplinary action.

Entry Fees

Entry fees will be standardised across Men's, Ladies and Seniors sections as follows:

- £4 per player for all 18 hole competitions when there is no pay-out for 2s
- £5 per player for all 18 hole competitions where there is a pay-out for 2s
- £2 per player for all 9 hole competitions, with no payment for 2s

Winter Course

During the Winter period, winter courses using specific tee boxes/mats will be utilized. Orange and Purple tees.

Disciplinary Code

All competitors have a responsibility when they participate in Club Competitions. There have been several occasions where people have entered competitions and have not arrived for the event. This causes confusion for the waiting playing partners and excludes other members from playing in the event. Please familiarise yourself with your obligations that are detailed below and help to make Competition golf enjoyable for all.

Hole in One Fund

1. The 'hole-in-one' fund will assist a competition competitor towards the cost of 'buying' fellow players a drink for achieving a 'hole-in-one' during a recognised SbN Club Competition.
2. A recognised SbN Club Competition is a competition where it is stated in the appropriate Competition Manual that the competition is eligible for 'hole in one' fund.
3. Limits. The maximum contribution for a 'hole-in-one' is up to £100 per 'hole-in-one'
4. The fund is appropriate to any competitor of a 'recognised SbN Club Competition'. This applies equally to Stoke by Nayland members, guests and visitors alike. An exception to this is a junior player who would not be expected to extend such hospitality.
5. This does not include any Essex County men or ladies' competitions or National competitions.
6. A bar receipt showing the actual expenditure must accompany all 'hole-in-one' payouts, plus proof via HDiDo software and/or a signed card. Please give these to Harry Hibbert.
7. Those members who achieve a 'hole-in-one' in a recognised club competition will be presented with a memento at the annual prize giving

Formats of Play

Stroke Play

The standard form of golf that you would play in medal competitions or maybe just friendly rounds. You simply just mark your score down that you score and add up to get a total at the end.

Stableford

A Stableford competition is a golf tournament in which the object is to get the *highest* score. That's because in Stableford, golfers are awarded points based on their score related to the nett par of the hole:-

- More than 1 over par(or no score returned) - 0 points
- One over par- 1 point
- Par- 2 points
- One under par- 3 points
- Two under par- 4 points
- Three under par- 5 points

Better Ball

A best ball competition in which the teams are comprised of two players. The two players on the team each play their own ball throughout the round. The low score, or better ball, among the two on each hole is the team's score for that hole.

Foursomes

Foursomes is a competition format in which teams are comprised of two players each, and the players alternate hitting the same ball. Players alternate hitting tee shots so that the same player doesn't hit every drive ie One player elects to drive the first hole and will then drive on every odd numbered hole, the other partner playing the even hole tee shots

Greensomes

Greensomes, is a competition format in which teams are comprised of two players each Both players on a team tee off, the best of the two tee balls is selected and that ball is then played alternate-shot until holed.

American Greensomes

American Greensomes, is a similar competition format to Greensomes. Both players on a team tee off, then they play their partner's ball. After the second shot the best ball is selected and that ball is then played alternate-shot until holed. Except on a par 3 where the best ball is selected from the tee shot.

St Andrews Greensomes

On all holes both players drive off. Before starting the first hole of the round, the players must decide which player will play the second stroke on ALL odd-numbered holes and the other player plays the second stroke on ALL even-numbered holes. This selection of player applies irrespective of

whose tee shot is used on that hole. Each subsequent stroke on a hole is made in alternating order through to completion of the hole.

Matchplay

Can be played in singles or in teams foursomes or fourballs. Basically you play for a hole. If you score better than your playing partner/s then you win the hole and go one up. If you win the next hole you go two up and so on. If you are say three up with three to play this is called 'Dormie' because you cannot lose.

If you are still level by the end of 18 holes then you finish all square unless you have to find a winner in which case you keep playing under sudden death rules until someone wins.

Texas Scramble (Florida Scramble)-

Texas Scramble is a team competition format of four players

All 4 players tee off. The team then select the best ball to play. All except the owner of that ball play from the approximate spot where it lay. (So only 3 balls are played). Then same as before -the best of the 3 balls is selected and again, the owner doesn't play and 3 balls are hit. This format continues until the green is reached. Once on the green the location of the best ball is selected. The only difference now is once a ball is selected, all 4 players play.

First ball in the hole determines the score.

When only 3 players in a team, all 3 players play the selected ball.

Minimum 4 tee shots per person.

Par Bogey

Par Bogey Competition – is when a player, plays against the PAR of each hole on the course, (which includes a player's handicap allowance for each hole). If the player's score is lower than the PAR score, the player wins the hole. If the player's score is the same as the PAR score, the hole is halved. If the player's score is higher than the PAR score, or no score is returned, the player loses the hole. These are then added together to determine the overall result.

Match Play Competition Handicaps (Paper calculation)

Course Handicap = $(HI \times Slope/113) + (CR - Par) = \text{Number then rounded.}$

Singles Match Play

Stroke Allowance is 100% of the rounded Course Handicap.

Then the difference between the 2 players Course handicap is the Matchplay allowance.

eg

Peter Course Handicap = 11

John Course Handicap = 15

Therefore John receives 4 shots for the match

Greensomes Match Play (Constable Bowls)

Individual Stroke Allowance is 60% of the lower course handicap plus 40% of the higher course handicap then rounded.

Then the difference between the Teams Playing handicap is the Matchplay allowance.

e.g.

Peter Course Handicap = 11

Mary Course Handicap = 15

Peter and Mary as a team their Playing Handicap would be: -

$(0.6 \times 11) + (0.4 \times 15) = 6.6 + 6.0 = 12.6$ rounded to 13 PH

If Peter and Mary play John and Jill's team who have a greensomes team handicap of 10.4 rounded to 10: -

Then Peter/Mary receive 3 shots for the match

Foursomes Match Play

In Foursomes match play, strokes are allocated based on 50% of the difference of the combined handicaps of each team.

e.g.

Therefore - Peter and John receive 13 shots for their match.

Four Ball Better Ball Match Play

Individual Match Play Stroke Allowance is 90% of the difference between individual Course Handicaps, based from the lowest course handicap.
